
Criminal record expungement program

CATC V The individual with a CATC V has a Doctorate in Addiction Studies or a related field from a regionally accredited college or university, and has met the requirements of the Basic CATC.

IV

CATC IV The individual with a CATC IV has a Master's Degree in Addiction Studies or a related field from a regionally accredited college or university, and has met the requirements of the Basic CATC.

The CATC Tiered System

encourages higher education by distinguishing individuals who have attained college and university degrees. The Addiction Counselor Certification Board of California (ACCBC) proudly recognizes CAADE as the future of certification standards for addiction counselors in the State of California.

CATC III The individual with a CATC III has a Bachelor's Degree in Addiction Studies or a related field from a regionally accredited college or university, and has met the requirements of the Basic CATC.

CATC II The individual with a CATC II has an Associate's Degree in Addiction Studies or a related field from a regionally accredited college or university, and has met the requirements of the Basic CATC.

CATC I The individual with a CATC I has completed a CAADE accredited addiction studies program or equivalent at a regionally accredited college or university and has met the requirements of the Basic CATC.

CATC N The individual with a CATC N has a Nursing degree from a regionally accredited college or university (or a school approved by the California Board of Nursing), and has met the requirements of the Basic CATC.

GIE

Basic CATC (Entry-Level) The individual with a basic CATC meets the minimum addiction studies education requirements by completing 21units or 315 hours in AOD education from a CAADE accredited or certified program (or equivalent), 250 hours of supervised practicum fieldwork, and 2080 hours of supervised internship, along with passing the CATC exam or other NCCA approved examination per California regulations.

Current Science of Addiction, Relapse & Recovery

This presentation will review past and current research on the neuroscience of Addiction, Relapse and recovery. Brain imaging and other research tools continue to discover variances in neuro-cellular, neuro-chemical, and neuro-functioning that underlie a vulnerability to develop compulsive and dysfunctional use of addictive substances or behaviors. The brain anomalies associated with addiction and related disorders also help to explain why some are more likely than others to relapse after treatment for their compulsive behaviors. The evolving science of Addiction Medicine provides new insights on preventing, assessing and treatment of addictions and related disorders. It is also providing more evidenced-based resources to better manage those with addiction and related disorders.

Alcoholism, addiction, dependence, or use disorder--does the name really matter? In a word, "yes." Rein in Your Brain Presenter: Cynthia Moreno-Tuohy

Many people in recovery often struggle with the compulsive thoughts and behaviors that are still programmed into the addictive limbic part of the brain and continue to work well after drinking and drugging has ended. This compulsiveness often plays out thoughtlessly in interactions with others, damaging relationships and growth as balanced human beings. The time tested are an intensive set of psycho-emotional-social-spiritual Cogitative Behavioral Therapy (CBT) interventions include: standing still in the moment, giving up the need to control, not assuming another's intentions, tolerating differences, accepting emotions without giving them free reign, and differentiating between immediate feardriven reactions and measured thoughts. By incorporating these techniques into one's daily interactions and lifestyle, relationships can move from those of conflict to mutual respect and understanding.

Issues & Answers About Certification & Licensure *Panel of Experts (Laws and Ethics)*

The issues surrounding addiction counselor certification and licensure in California, and the nation, can often seem confusing for students, counselors, and employers. This panel will discuss everything you ever wanted to know about Addiction Counselor Certification Regulations in California, the "5-year rule," education and supervision requirements, pending Master's Level Licensure legislation, and other topics relevant to you and your future. Bring your questions and concerns for an informative Q&A session with state and national experts.

The Courage to Change the One We Can

Presenter: Rosemary Kane

Addiction passes through families generationally, and is said to be the "gift that keeps on giving." It keeps on giving because of a strong compulsion to repeat what is experienced in our families of origin - although we say, "it will never happen to me." We can break this cycle and begin to have healthy and productive relationships with ourselves and others. We can use a little bundle of nerves in our brains to enact the ability to attract serenity - not chaos.

Technology Addiction Presenter: Dr. Don Grant

Cell phones, the internet and computers have become the new drug of choice for many families. This session will outline the risk factors for a technology addiction. People who are already suffering from anxiety, depression, or are under a great deal of stress are strong candidates for developing a technology addiction. Internet addiction creates problems that are similar to other addictions in that it can affect relationships, make a person spend more time by themselves, and thus create social anxiety. Dr. Grant will discuss how to help clients find ways to use technology successfully so that they still be able to navigate the other areas of life.

Medical Marijuana in a World of Addiction

Presenter: Allan Barger

Those advocating for the medical use of marijuana often intentionally or unintentionally send a message that there is no risk from the use of marijuana even if recreational. Those who practice in the world of addiction know there are risks, but untangling the message for clients can be daunting. Moreover, there is a growing body of research documenting some risks and harms associated with ongoing marijuana use. This presentation distinguishes between legitimate medical investigations into the use of cannabis or the cannabinoids – including recommendations from the National Institutes of Health – and risks from both medical and recreational use.




Service. He now serves as the Region IX Administrator for the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

In Memory of Ron Vanevenhoven



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
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


Map of Conference Center
